We will keep the observatory open from sunset until 11:00 p.m. for all ghostly ghouls who wish to view the celestial heavens. (Costumes not required)

We will have a Bootiful time and Halloween snacks will be provided for participants, as long as they last. Please keep in mind the following:

- It will be cold so dress warmly, with layers.
- Georgia Highlands is a non-tobacco use campus.
- If it is already dark when you arrive at the observatory parking lot, turn your vehicle lights off and carefully use your parking lights.
- If you wish to bring a flashlight, that is fine but be sure to have a
  piece of red cellophane covering the lens to keep the brightness
  down.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult.
